



KEY HEALTH AND NUTRITIONAL BENEFITS OF WIC



Reduces the prevalence of household food insecurity, increases housing security, lifts participants above the poverty line, and protects against economic hardship



Reduces the incidence of preterm births and low birth weight



Reduces incidence of iron-deficiency anemia among infants and children




Increases access to early prenatal care and encourages breastfeeding




Improves diet quality and intake of key nutrients







Infants and children up to age 5 account for 78% of WIC participation in Pennsylvania

Thriving PA has identified policy priorities to remove barriers to access and increase participation in the state's WIC program:

- Improve cross-system and cross-department communication to streamline the application and recertification process for families.
- Strengthen, diversify and increase the cultural competency of the WIC workforce.
- Expand eligibility to age 6 to ensure children are able to receive benefits until they begin kindergarten and extend eligibility for postpartum women to two years.

Diversity of Pennsylvania WIC Participants





- Transition to an online Smart Card for redeeming WIC benefits, permanently implement telehealth policies, and utilize mobile units.
- Increase awareness about the benefits of WIC among legislators, community-based organizations, healthcare professionals, and others who serve the WIC population.
